**TAFISA**

TAFISA is the leading international Sports for All and physical activity organisation, with members in over 130 countries from all continents. TAFISA is officially recognized by IOC, UNESCO and WHO, and is in active cooperation with all three, as well as working relationships with ICSSPE, FISpT, ISCA and others. TAFISA promotes Sport for All and physical activity internationally, and provides practical programs for its members.

**TAFISA Certified Leadership Courses**

One such program is the TAFISA Certified Leadership Course (CLC) in Sport for All. This program was developed to train and qualify national Sport for All leaders around the globe.

Courses run for 4 to 5 working days, and typically invite a maximum of 30 local and international participants from the region. Participants enjoy a fantastic educational program, as well as a sports, social and sightseeing program. And of course, the CLCs provide an excellent opportunity for national and regional networking, as well as the opportunity for participants to present briefly on Sport for All in their country.

Each CLC concludes with an oral examination and participants receive a course certificate acknowledging their participation and contribution. Since its inception in 2007, International TAFISA CLCs have been successfully held in Iran, Nigeria, Tanzania, China, Australia, Malaysia, Turkey, Argentina. In 2010, the International Olympic Committee signed a Memorandum of Understanding with TAFISA to further develop the CLC program, and this has resulted in the commencement of national courses also.



**Serbia**

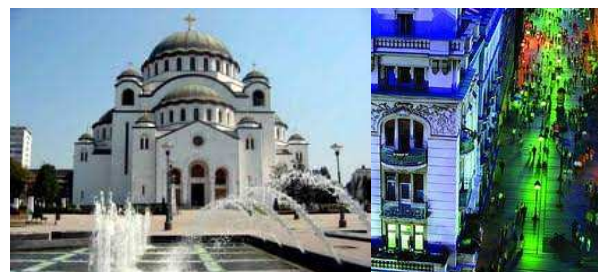

Belgrade is the capital of Serbian culture, education, science and economy. The official language is Serbian, while visitors from abroad can use English to communicate.
